

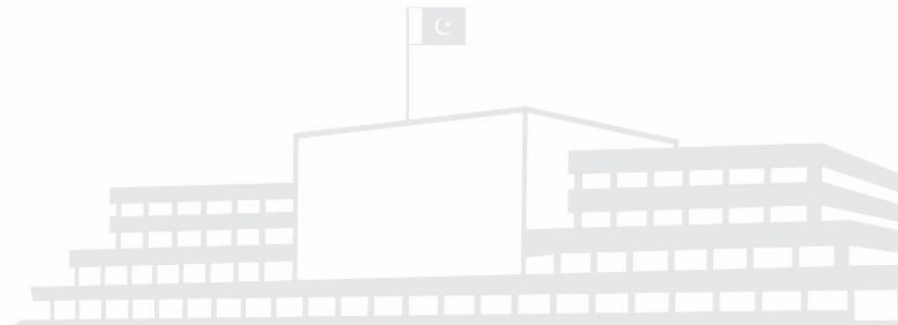

## PARTY POSITION IN 15<sup>TH</sup> NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

The 15th National Assembly (NA) was sworn in on August 13, 2018. Currently, there are 330 members in the House. As many as nine seats have been vacated by the legislators who had won more than one seat in GE-2018. Moreover, two general seats are vacant due to postponement of election while a woman-reserved seat of KP is also vacant. The incumbent Assembly has a representation of 12 political parties as compared to 18 parties represented in the previous Assembly. Additionally, there are four independent legislators in the House. See the table for party position in NA.

The largest party PTI has 48% of National Assembly's General and women reserved seats in Punjab, 72% in KP, 26% in Sindh, 15% in Balochistan and all in ICT. PML-N occupies 45% of Punjab and 7% of KP seats. PPP secured 59% of Sindh, 4% of Punjab and 2% of KP seats. MMAP got 30% of Balochistan and 14% of KP seats. Of the remaining, PML got four and AMLP one Punjab seat, respectively. Moreover, the remaining Balochistan seats were divided among BAP (5), BNP (4), JWP (1) and an independent. In addition, ANP won one and independents two seats in KP. In Sindh, MQM got seven, GDA three and an independent one seat. The seats reserved for non-Muslims were distributed among PTI (5), PML-N (2), PPP (2) and MMAP (1).

## PARLIAMENTARY EXPERIENCE OF 15TH NA LEGISLATORS

Of the 330 incoming legislators, 132 have been elected to any legislature for the first time while 129 were the members of the outgoing Assembly as well. Moreover, two former senators, 26 members of the 13<sup>th</sup> or earlier National Assemblies, 41 former members of provincial assemblies are also part of the 15<sup>th</sup> NA. Most of the PML-N members (58 out of 81) have been re-elected from the 14<sup>th</sup> NA. Of 129 legislators who were members of the last NA, 16 have changed their political affiliations. As many as 13 of these legislators represented PML-N in the 14<sup>th</sup> NA but will now represent PTI (11), PPPP (1) and BAP (1). Moreover, one legislator each of JI and PPPP has defected to PTI and one of PPPP to GDA. See the table for newcomers and former legislators elected to the 15<sup>th</sup> NA.

## EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION OF 15TH NA LEGISLATORS

Nearly one third (116) of the incoming legislators hold a Bachelors and 72 have a Masters' Degree. The Assembly also has four Engineers and 18 legislators have qualified in the Medicine or Dentistry while six hold a Postgraduate Degree including two having a Doctorate Degree. Moreover, a female legislator has declared herself illiterate while two have not declared their literacy level. ## PROFESSIONAL DIVERSITY AMONG 15TH NA LEGISLATORS

A majority of the incoming legislators (172) are agriculturists or businesspersons by profession while 24 others are landlords. As many as 32 legislators have declared them to be full time politicians, parliamentarians or political and social activists. Moreover, the Assembly has 13 practicing doctors and 14 housewives as well.

## PENDING CRIMINAL CASES AGAINST 15TH NA LEGISLATORS

## LEGISLATORS' ASSETS

Nearly one third (112) legislators have declared their assets worth between 11 million PKR and 50 million PKR while 58 had the assets worth one to 10 million PKR. As many as 12 legislators have assets having worth ranging between 501 million PKR and one billion PKR while five legislators have the assets less than one million PKR.

## RICHEST AND POOREST AMONG LEGISLATORS IN 15TH NA

The new Assembly has eight billionaires with PTI's Noor Alam Khan being the wealthiest legislator. His net worth as declared on the Form B of Nomination Papers is more than 3.2 billion PKR. Among eight billionaires, four belong to PTI, two to PML-N and one each to PPP and ANP.

On the other hand, five legislators had less than one million worth of assets. As many as two of these legislators belong to PTI, and one each to PML-N, MQM and PPP.


